# **WATER Commission Annual Review:**

### 2017 Highlights:

- Attended multiple training seminars and was awarded the 2017 Water Operator of the Year by the Indiana Rural Water Association
- 100% Compliance with IDEM
- Marked all GPS coordinates for hydrants and valves; also utilizing GPS every time we dig up a water or service line
- 95% of all hydrants have been repainted
- New purchases included a line locator and GPS equipment
- Toured the Ford Meter Box plant in Wabash, Indiana which is where we buy the majority of our water parts and supplies
- In the process of writing an official Water Operational Procedures to help current and future employees
- Mike Roberts joined our staff part-time with 7 years of water utility experience
- Welcomed Denise Caudill to the Water Commission; she replaces long-time member Duane
  Mercer who moved out of the area this year

Most of 2017 was spent working on and supervising the Water Capital Projects. Daily meetings with onsite engineers and contractors helped move this project forward and helped it to get completed ontime. I was very pleased with our contractors and our engineering firm whom all agreed that the overall project was very successful.

We are about 98% completed with the Capital Projects. Remaining tasks include finishing the SCADA, installing a gate at the new booster station, installing the bollards at the master meter, electricity at the master meter, and final clean-up this spring by Brackney.
