- 4. Welcome and Pledge of Allegiance: Mr. Engle called the meeting to order at 7:02 PM.
- 5. Meeting Agenda Modifications: Mrs. Wethington requested that Road/Water Invoice be added to line item 8.a.
- 6. Approval of Minutes:

MOTION: Mr. Sherman moved to approve the March 19, 2019 Board minutes as submitted, seconded by Mr. Benshoof. Motion passed unanimously.

3. Freeholder Mr. Lawson brought his future garage property to the attention of the Board and noted that he has been in contact with CSCD Attorney Roger Young in establishing some restrictive covenants for his property.

MOTION: Mr. Sherman moved to approve the attached restrictive covenants provided by Roger Young, seconded by Mr. Benshoof. Motion passed unanimously.

RESTRICTIVE COVENANTS

These restrictive covenants are intended to run with the land and be binding on Grantee's successors in interest, heirs and assigns. Grantor and Grantee agree that this restrictive covenant may be enforced by Grantor, Grantee, their respective successors in interest, heirs and assigns, and the Cordry-Sweetwater Conservancy District, acting by and through its Board of Directors. The following restrictions are imposed upon the real estate:

- 1. No water service shall be provided by Cordry-Sweetwater Conservancy District to the real estate.
- 2. No structures may be constructed upon the real estate except for a garage, which shall be constructed in strict compliance with all Brown County and Cordry-Sweetwater Conservancy District Building Rules.
- 3. The real estate may not be conveyed separately from the real estate owned by Grantee described as Lots Numbered WS-540 and WS-541, Sweetwater Lake Addition, Plat Number 43, which plat is recorded in Plat Cabinet No. 1, Sleeve 119A, in the office of the Recorder of Brown County, Indiana, together with;

A part of the Southwest quarter of the Southwest quarter of Section 7, Township 10 North, Range 4 East of the Second Principal Meridian, also being a part of Sweetwater Lake Addition, Plat Sheet Number 43 and recorded in Plat Cabinet No. 1, Sleeve 119A in the office of the Recorder of Brown County, Indiana, described as follows:

Beginning at the Southwest corner of Lot WS-541 in Sweetwater Lake Addition, Plat Sheet Number 43; thence on and along the South line of said Lot WS-541, South 86 degrees 25 minutes East 35.00 feet to the common corner of Lots WS-541 and Lot WS-540; thence on and along the Southwesterly line of said Lot WS-540, South 45 degrees 24 minutes East 50.1 feet to the Southeasterly corner of Lot WS-540; thence South 51 degrees 46 minutes 58 seconds West 41.81 feet to the Northeasterly right-of-way of Bobwhite Drive; thence Northwesterly on and along said right-of-way, North 58 degrees 46 minutes 16 seconds West 39.13 feet; thence continuing on and along said right-of-way, North 62 degrees 50 minutes 16 seconds West 19.78 feet; thence North 21 degrees 25 minutes 00 seconds East 36.43 feet to the point of beginning, containing 0.072 acre, more or less.

4. The real estate shall not be considered a separate freehold within the Cordry-Sweetwater Conservancy District for any purpose whatsoever, but rather shall be considered to be a part of the freehold described as Lot WS-540, Sweetwater Lake Addition, Plat Number 43, which plat is recorded in Plat Cabinet No. 1, Sleeve 119A, in the office of the Recorder of Brown County, Indiana; together with A part of the Southwest quarter of the Southwest quarter of Section 7, Township 10 North, Range 4 East of the Second Principal Meridian, also being a part of Sweetwater Lake Addition, Plat Sheet Number 43 and recorded in Plat Cabinet No. 1, Sleeve 119A in the office of the Recorder of Brown County, Indiana, described as follows:

Beginning at the Southwest corner of Lot WS-541 in Sweetwater Lake Addition, Plat Sheet Number 43; thence on and along the South line of said Lot WS-541, South 86 degrees 25 minutes East 35.00 feet to the common corner of Lots WS-541 and Lot WS-540; thence on and along the Southwesterly line of said Lot WS-540, South 45 degrees 24 minutes East 50.1 feet to the Southeasterly corner of Lot WS-540; thence South 51 degrees 46 minutes 58 seconds West 41.81 feet to the Northeasterly right-of-way of Bobwhite Drive; thence Northwesterly on and along said right-of-way, North 58 degrees 46 minutes 16 seconds West 39.13 feet; thence continuing on and along said right-of-way, North 62 degrees 50 minutes 16 seconds West 19.78 feet; thence North 21 degrees 25 minutes 00 seconds East 36.43 feet to the point of beginning, containing 0.072 acre, more or less.

- 5. Grantor and Grantee and CSCD agree that these restrictive covenants shall run with the land and may be enforced by Grantor, Grantee or CSCD, individually or collectively.
- 6. There are no third-party beneficiaries to these covenants. The covenants may be enforced only by Lawson, Bartley or CSCD, their heirs, successors in interest or assigns, either jointly or individually. In the event suit is filed to enforce these covenants, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from any non-prevailing party any costs or damages, including reasonable attorney fees incurred by the prevailing party.
- 7. These covenants may be amended only by CSCD, acting through its Board of Directors, and CSCD reserve the right to amend these covenants in its sole discretion at any time.
